Tariff terms and conditions

About your tariff

The electricity tariff is based on a daily standing charge and our standard unit rate (as of 30th September 2014), which is fixed until 31st January 2016. The unit rate will be zero between 9am–5pm on either Saturday or Sunday. You'll still have to pay the standing charge on your free day though.

The gas tariff you need to switch to is our Standard variable tariff, based on a daily standing charge and single unit rate. You'll need to stay on this gas tariff for the length of your contract.

We can tell you all about the tariffs when you call to switch. Or you can see the prices on our website: britishgas.co.uk/tariffprices. We'll also confirm everything when we write to welcome you to the new tariff.

How it works

You choose whether you want free electricity on Saturdays or Sundays. We'll confirm the day you choose when we send you the welcome pack, as well as in your bills and annual statement. Once you've chosen a day, you'll need to stick to it for the length of the contract. (So you can't swap between Saturdays and Sundays.)

Fair's fair though – we'll contact you if we think you're using an unreasonably large amount of electricity on your free day. Like if you start doing washing for the whole street, or set up a restaurant in your living room. And we may have to take you off the tariff if we think you're using it unfairly.

Paying for your energy

You'll need to pay by Direct Debit, Cash or Cheque. If you don't, your rates will change and your prices may be higher.

If you pay by Direct Debit but miss any payments, we can ask you to pay by Cash or Cheque. You'd then lose your Direct Debit discount and your prices would increase – we'll explain the difference in your welcome pack, or you can find the details at britishgas.co.uk/tariffprices.

We may need to change your payment methods between now and 31st January 2016, but we'll write to you at least 14 working days before we do.

If you decide to cancel

If you switch to another energy supplier before 31st January 2016, we may charge you a £30 electricity tariff exit fee.

If this happens, we'll collect this before any other amounts you owe us, either from payments you make or your credit balance.

If you change your meter

You can only be on this tariff with smart meters. If you move to prepayment, multi-rate or standard credit meters, we'll change your tariff to British Gas's cheapest Standard variable tariff at the time.

At the end of the tariff

Before your Free Saturdays or Sundays January 2016 tariff ends, we'll write to tell you what will happen next. If we don't hear from you, we'll move you to the cheapest standard variable tariff we have available on 31st January 2016.

We'll offer our Free Saturdays or Sundays January 2016 tariff at a fixed price + VAT until 31st January 2016, unless the government or regulator does something, or plans something, that means we can't. (We hope not, but we have to let you know.)

This tariff is subject to availability and we might withdraw it.
